Safety Management Systems

- SMS policies, processes, procedures and systems in place for Certified Airports
- Focus shifted toward continuous improvement
- Initial audits at all Certified Airports have been completed
- The annual 4 year cyclical audit program is underway;
 6-7 sites per year
- TC Assessment in Yellowknife last year, PVIs planned in Inuvik Region this year
- Emergency exercises have or are planned in Aklavik,
 Wekweeti, LutselK'e, Fort Good Hope and Hay River

Community Capacity Building

- 1st round of Emergency Exercises have now been completed at all sites
- Identified some challenges and some ways to move forward
- Adopted streamlined and scalable approach to emergency exercise training
- Has led to Increasing engagement of industry, community, GNWT and other levels of government in exercises
- A number of registered sites have expressed interest and/or taken the training



- Updating Airport Development Plans


